BIOGRAPHIES

Bob Ackroyd (Senex) — Bob does just about anything around the NFCT, on stage and off, except musicals. So what is he doing in the cast of Forum? He claims to have auditioned during a momentary mental lapse when no one on the casting committee was listening to him "sing". He respectfully asks the audience to be kind.

John Oliver Ashton (Erroneous) — John studied at the Telly Savalas Conservatory of Music and has appeared in such hit musicals at the NFCT as *Man of La Mancha* and *Finian's Rainbow*. In addition to his vocal talents, John occasionally acts in non-musicals such as *Da*. He is not as old as he looks.

Annette Bednosky (Panacea) — Forum is Annette's third appearance on the NFCT stage. Last summer she was seen in Anything Goes and before that Teahouse of the August Moon. At Southold High School where Annette is a junior, she has appeared in Guys and Dolls, On Broadway, and earlier this spring was Emily in Our Town. In her spare time, she loves photography, art, aqua blue, and singing. Quack, Quack.

Jed Clauss (Protean) — A protean/eunuch who has just become a father for the third time, Jed has spent the winter practicing his falls and singing in the

shower in order to try out for this show.

Mindy Cohen (Vibrata) — Although a newcomer to the NFCT stage, Mindy has performed in a number of musicals and concerts with other theater groups and studied acting and voice for a number of years with Lillian Caran of the Masque Young People's Theatre of Smithtown. There, she performed in various musicals and one-act plays. She also studied voice in New York City with Helen Gallager, well known to stage and television.

Jack Conforti (Protean) — No stranger to the NFCT stage, Jack's credits include Lil Abner, Godspell, Applause, Once Upon a Mattress, The Boyfriend, Teahouse of the August Moon, and Anything Goes. At the Riverhead High School, he has appeared in Mame and Hello Dolly. Jack just finished a long run as a jewelry salesman in Woolco and plans to study theater begining this fall at Sullivan County Community College upstate. Jack lives in Riverhead and is studying voice with Maryanne McElroy.

Michael Conforti (Hero) — Applause was Michael's first appearance with the NFCT followed by The Boyfriend. Desperate Hours. Teahouse of the August Moon, Anuthing Goes, and Frankenstein. This past winter, he choreographed the Greenport High School musical. Annie Get Your Gun. Michael lives in Riverhead and is a floral design instructor at the Harry B. Ward Occupational Center.

Lauren Dickerson (Philia) — A veteran member of the NFCT now for 9 years. Lauren spends her time away from the theatre improving her voice and her softball game, planning her wedding, fixing up her new/old house, and lots of other fun things. A real blonde? Only her hairdresser knows for sure.

Rose Kobus (Protean) - A resident of Aquebogue, Rose lives with her husband, Mike, and two daughters. For our last production, Chapter Two, Rose worked backstage but this is her first time on stage. Also, she is a

volunteer for the Riverhead Public Library.

Michael Losquadro (Pseudolus) — Last seen as Sakini in Teahouse of the August Moon, Michael has appeared in leading roles in Lenny, Butterflies are Free, South Pacific, Fiorello, and One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest among others with many other local theaters including Bellport Playcrafters and Theatre Three. Living in Bellport with Marie, his wife, and Kristin, his daughter, Michael works at Brookhaven National Labs.

Don Peterson (Miles Glorisus) — Don lives in Jamesport and works for the Little Flower Association in Wading River. This is Don's first, but hopefully

She is also Senior Vice President of the Vail Leavitt Music Hall in Riverhead. Eileen is a former TWA Air Hostess, a music lover, and a theatre enthusiast.

Jackie James Ostuni (Director) — Even though this is Jackie's directing debut, she brings a great deal of experience to the NFCT. Over the last twenty weeks, she has performed in Caberet as a singer and dancer at Airport Playhouse, had the part of Jenny in Chapter Two and worked in a major motion picture to be released this fall starring Elliot Gould and Bert Young. She studied theater and dance at the University of Minnesota and to take up the slack in her career, works as a model and is a former Playboy bunny. She lives in Shoreham with her husband and actor son and even though Jackie shines on stage, it has nothing to do with the surplus radiation coming from the nearby nuclear reactor!

Bill Sousa (Producer) — Having done almost all there is to do around the NFCT, Bill spent last winter directing the Greenport High School production of *Annie Get Your Gun* and plans to return there for years to come.
