



How to download Libby books onto Kindle device




This is the Libby app homepage


Set your Libby reading preferences in settings by clicking the middle menu button



Scroll down to see "Read Books With..."




Make sure "Kindle" is selected




Now you're ready to search for books


Use the **Q** icon to search by title or author




Click on "Borrow"



Next click on "Read with Kindle"






if your screen looks like this & you don't see the "read with Kindle option," See Step 1


You'll be taken to Amazon's website. If prompted, sign into your Amazon account.

Then, click on "Get Library Book"




Click "done" in the upper left

Don't click on "Read Now in the Kindle App" unless you are reading on your phone or an ipad.




Now you are ready to read with your Kindle.

First, make sure your Kindle is connected to wifi.




Once you are connected to wifi, your Libby book should appear in your Kindle library.
